Sich üben in Lieben (from BWV 202)

To be accustomed, in love, to cuddle in playful tenderness is better than
Flora's fading delights.
Here the waves swell,
Here on lip and breast
The triumphal palms smile and wave.

Welt, ade, ich bin dein müde (from BWV 158)

Recit: Peace be with you, oh anxious conscience!
Your Intercessor stands here,
Who the record-book of your guilt and the curse of the law
Has reconciled and torn up.
Peace be with you,
The prince of this world, which obstructed your soul, is through the Lamb's blood conquered and
appeased.
My heart, why are you so troubled, when God so loves you through Christ?
He Himself says to me: peace be with you!

Aria: World, farewell, I am tired of you, the tents of Salem stand before me, where in rest and peace,
forever happy, I shall behold God.
There I shall stay, there I shall delight to dwell, there I shall sparkle resplendent with a heavenly crown.

Chorale: World, farewell! I am tired of you, I want to go to heaven, true peace and eternal, glorious
rest will be there.
World, war and conflict are yours, nothing but pure vanity; in haven eternally is peace, joy, and
happiness.

Ach, Schläfrige Seele (from BWV 115)

Ah slumbering spirit, what? Still at thy rest?
Arouse thyself now!
For well may damnation thee sudden awaken
And, if thou not watchest
In slumber of lasting perdition obscure thee.

Feilich trotz Augustus' Name (from BWV 215)

Certainly the name of Augustus, who is the seed of such noble gods, defies all the power of mortality.
And the citizens of the provinces or such virtuous princes live in the golden time.

Dixit Dominus (Psalm 110)

1 The Lord said unto my Lord: Sit thou on my right hand, until I make thine enemies thy footstool.

2 The Lord shall send the rod of thy power out of Sion: be thou ruler, even in the midst among thine enemies.

3 In the day of thy power shall the people offer thee free-will offerings with an holy worship: the dew of thy birth is of the womb of the morning.

4 The Lord sware, and will not repent: Thou art a priest for ever after the order of Melchisedech.

5 The Lord upon thy right hand: shall wound even kings in the day of his wrath.

6 He shall judge among the heathen; he shall fill the places with the dead bodies: and smite in sunder the heads over divers countries.

7 He shall drink of the brook in the way: therefore shall he lift up his head.

8 Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.
